Description: The O*NET Program is the nation's primary source of occupational information. Central to the project is the O*NET database (free to the public), covering almost 1,000 occupations across the entire U.S. economy. Used by millions of individuals every year, the data has proven vital in helping people find the training and jobs they need, and employers the skilled workers necessary to be competitive in the marketplace.

What they offer:

- Complete the O*NET Interest Profiler (FREE)
 - Can help you find out what your interests are and it helps you decide what kinds of careers you might want to explore.
- Search tools with a choice of windows through which to identify occupations and further explore, including: Career Clusters, Job Zones, STEM occupations, Job Families, and Tools and Technology.
- Each report includes national wage and employment projection information: projected growth, and projected need. State specific information is available via [CareerOneStop](#).

Description: An official website of the United States government. The Occupational Outlook Handbook (OOH) provides information on what workers do; the work environment; education, training, and other qualifications; pay; the job outlook; information on state and area data; similar occupations; and sources of additional information for more than 300 occupational profiles covering about 4 out of 5 jobs in the economy.

What they offer:

- The OOH is broken up into clusters of similar occupations you can search and learn more about.
- In addition, you may browse by clicking any of the four links titled “highest paying,” “fastest growing (projected),” “most new jobs (projected),” and “field of degree.”
